Future Direction of AOTS

David Morris presented a resolution on behalf of the Executive. Those present were asked for their comments and the group was divided into small groups for further discussion. The following comments were captured:

- We believe there is a need for a resource within the Church that supports men's clubs, AOTS clubs, men's fellowships, men's ministries and other men's organizations at the congregational, regional, or national level. There is nothing available today to tie such organizations together in a way that facilitates communication and sharing.
- We believe there would be value in a common website and better use of social media.
- We want to ensure that men are not forgotten as the Church evolves and changes.
- The National AOTS is the only national organization involved in men's work. As such, AOTS is the only organization that could initiate a national initiative.
- It is important that AOTS continue this initiative since Men's Ministry is a very low priority for the Church.
- We hope the Church will embrace this initiative and see it as a process that must be implemented with some urgency.
- Suggestion: Use the AOTS website, or a new website, in cooperation with the Church as a key element of this strategy. Encourage all other men's clubs and groups to use it.
- Question: Who will do this work? Answer: The Executive will be doing this work initially; but may draw in others.
- It was noted that communication to clubs and individuals has been problematic for a long time.
- The camp improvement grants are seen as a good use of AOTS funds.
- We recognize that clubs are declining in size and numbers.
- We are concerned about spiritual growth opportunities for younger men. Do they need a small group (in person or on line) that fosters their spiritual growth?

- Churches are closing. As such, the UC representation in the community may be in decline.
- Many people see themselves as "spiritual" or "religious"; but don't feel they need a church experience to support them.

Resolved that: Resolved that Executive investigate a new approach to Men's Ministry across Canada in conjunction with the United Church of Canada

Conference Updates:

Brief updates about conference activities were offered by Bill Love (West), John Cooke (Central), and Gary Ross (West).

National Camp Improvement Project: John Cooke

Project status and activity to date was reviewed briefly. A presentation prepared by John will be made available on the web site. Newmarket Trinity Club will take on the role of Project Committee as of September 1, 2015. The Executive approved the following changes to the Project Guiding Principles for the next 3 years:

- Grants to be a maximum of \$2000.
- Total funds available will be \$6000/yr. If donations to the project are greater than \$6000, then the additional funds will be made available for grants.
- Terry Pond will need to advise Newmarket Trinity of the total funds available in January of each year

Motion of Thanks to Jackson's Point Camp & Conference Center:
